The Nov. 9 event brought pet lovers together at Centennial Park

Gulf Coast Humane Society's second Bark in the Park event on Nov. 9 raised \$22,500, up from the inaugural year's total of \$14,100.

The event drew 165 attendees and 24 vendors to Centennial Park in Fort Myers.
